Samantha Rowe—Music Assembly

On Monday we welcomed Samantha who Played 'Zoom Tube' on flute, a contemporary piece. We discussed different genres of music and 'Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra' by Benjamin Britten. Children listened to some of the piece and identified instruments they could hear. Next up, all children had a turn at conducting, by counting 4 beats in a bar of a classical piece of music. They then played a beatboxing tune and an Irish folk song on the piccolo. Next, we heard some Japanese music on the alto flute. Then, we heard a Latin piece which included theme and variation. The children asked questions, "Do you perform for people?", "Do you go to music university?".

Treverbyn workshop: We played 'Don't clap this one back' and rapped 'Yo, my name is Joe'. It was hard to rap and push all the buttons with our body parts. Treverbyn listened to Samantha playing short pieces on the flute about Rivers, which was Treverbyn's music focus last term. She discussed how we can interpret music in so many ways. Then we composed a short piece of music with river themed ostinatos. We worked on our dynamics. Every section had a turn at each of our ideas to represent a river. It was so much fun.
