



GOVERNORS AND THE SCHOOL COUNCIL

The Governing Board and School Council work in tandem to make sure the school is a safe environment, well staffed and resourced. Governors make regular visits, co-ordinated with our current School Development Plan, to ensure the school is on track to meet its targets.

Last week Peter Dukes, our Pastoral Care governor, met with the School Council and together they discussed what the school does well and what might need improving. They also discussed the UN Bill of Rights for Children and Peter gave the School Council a poster of the main points to keep. Peter was very impressed with the children's knowledge and the questions they were asking.

PARENT HELP NEEDED FOR AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

GOVERNOR ROLE

Our main role is to support the Headteacher and the staff - the phrase often used to describe this role is 'a critical friend'. We help them to set and reach targets and to strive for excellence across the whole spectrum of school life. The two key documents used for this are the School Development Plan (SDP) and the Self Evaluation Form (SEF). The SDP sets out a three year strategic plan for the school, with targets that everyone works towards and the SEF sets out how well the school is doing and where we aim to make improvements.

- setting strategic direction, policies and objectives
- approving the school budget
- reviewing progress against the school's budget and objectives
- appointing, challenging and supporting the headteacher

RESIDENTIAL VISIT MEETING 16TH OCTOBER 3.10PM


